



OUR ORCHESTRAL FAMILY

THE STRING FAMILY

There are more than 40 players in the **string section** because it takes many strings to create a balanced sound with the rest of the orchestra. Instruments of the string family include the **violin**, **viola**, **cello**, **double bass**, and **harp**.






THE BRASS FAMILY

Instruments of the brass family include the **trumpet**, **trombone**, **tuba**, and **French horn**. They are made of metal, and sound is created by the players buzzing their lips against mouthpieces and blowing air. The pitch is changed by adjusting the length of the airway, either by depressing valves or by moving the slide.

THE WOODWIND FAMILY

Woodwinds are made from various combinations of wood, plastic, and metal. The woodwind family includes instruments such as the **flute**, **piccolo**, **oboe**, **clarinet**, **saxophone**, and **bassoon**. These instruments require lots of air, which makes the mouthpiece vibrate. The pitch is changed by pressing keys that cover tone holes.





THE PERCUSSION FAMILY

The **percussion family** includes instruments that are struck, scraped, or shaken to produce a sound. These instruments include **drums**, **timpani**, **xylophone**, **cymbals**, **gongs**, and **wood blocks**, to name a few. Did you know that **pianos** are actually percussion instruments, too?

THE RHYTHM SECTION

Our orchestral family is a little different due to popular music's dependence on what is called "the rhythm section," a group of instruments which usually features **drums**, **bass**, **guitar**, and **piano or keyboard**.



Named After: Scottish-American businessman and

philanthropist, Andrew Carnegie

RODGERS & HAMMERSTEIN FUN FACTS RICHARD RODGERS

Richard Rodgers & Oscar Hammerstein II are considered to be one of the most successful composer and lyricist pairings in musical theater history. Between 1943-1959 they wrote eleven musicals including the "big five": Oklahoma!, Carousel, South Pacific, The King and I, and The **Sound of Music**

Carousel was both Rodgers

Richard Rodgers wrote 900 songs, many of which were in his 43 **Broadway musicals! Oscar** Hammerstein II wrote the lyrics to 850 songs.

34 Tony Awards, 15 Academy and Hammerstein's Awards, two Pulitzer Prizes, favorite of all their shows.



Rodgers

and Hammerstein

won numerous awards.

Collectively they garnered

and two Grammy Awards.

OSCAR HAMMERSTEIN II

In 1920. Rodgers and Hammerstein created their first song "Room for One More" for an amateur show at Columbia University. The team would not create anything together for another 23 years until they created Oklahoma!

Richard Rodgers was born in New York on June 28, 1902. He knew that he wanted to be a composer from a young age. **Oscar Hammerstein II was** born in New York on July 12, 1885. He originally was planning on being a lawyer!
